

The Canadian Pacific Building, London



The Canadian Pacific Building at 62–65 Trafalgar Square (formerly 62–65 Charing Cross) is an office building in Westminster in London, England. It was constructed as the London offices of the Canadian Pacific Railway Company and its affiliated steamship line (CP Ships), hotel chain (Canadian Pacific Hotels) and other subsidiary companies.

It is faced with Portland stone and features prominent CANADIAN PACIFIC signage and a small clock tower. Until 2011 the building was occupied by commercial and law offices, but underwent re-development by BMB for conversion into luxury apartments.

The project was completed in late 2012 and the historic structure renamed "Trafalgar One".

Trafalgar One

The Canadian Pacific Building, 62-65 Trafalgar Square, is situated on the south side of Trafalgar Square with spectacular views of the National Gallery and Nelson's Column.

The building was formerly the headquarters of the renowned railway, hotel and steamship company. Built in Portland stone and incorporating a clock tower, the building is a landmark in the largest and best-known London square.

LBS Properties carried out a sensitive conversion of the building to provide four large, lateral apartments and a duplex-penthouse. The heritage of the building, outstanding interior design and unparalleled views lead to record pricing for this area of London.
